FAST-NU's 16th, 17th convocations held 293 graduates awarded degrees at Islamabad convocation



Sixteenth convocation of the FAST-NU was held at Islamabad Campus on January 2. Dr. Ishfaq Ahmad, Deputy Chariman and Advisor (S&T), Planning Commission, was the chief guest. Degrees were conferred upon 293 graduates in Computer Science, Business Administration & Telecom Engineering. Twenty four medals were also awarded to graduates for academic excellence.

Dr. Aftab A. Maroof, Director, delivered the welcome address. He attributed the accomplishments of Islamabad Campus to commitment of the faculty, hard work of the students and the support and guidance of the university management. He said that "NU Islamabad Campus graduates have earned a respectable place in both national and multi-national organizations. The feedback from the industry about the performance of our graduates bears testimony to this."

Dr. Amir Muhammed, Rector, highlighted the strengths of FAST-NU and its national reach through four campuses nationwide. He said that fifty of the 300 full-time faculty members hold PhD degrees from reputable foreign universities. The Rector underscored the need for adherence to merit as an instrument for producing quality graduates.

He said, "No student is denied admission due to his or her inability to pay the tuition fee. The university gives financial aid by way of Qarz-e-Hasna, which amounted to more than Rs50 million in the current year." He maintained that the quality of education imparted by this university was recognized locally as well as internationally.

470 Lahore Campus students awarded degrees

Seventeenth convocation of the FAST-NU was held at Lahore Campus on January 16, 2010. Mr. Mujtaba Shuja ur Rehman, Minister for Education, Punjab, was the chief guest on the occasion.

This was the biggest convocation in the history of the FAST-NU, where 400 undergraduate and 70 graduate students were awarded degrees. Forty five students were honored with the medals for academic achievements.

FAST-NU team participates in world universities debating competition

A FAST-NU team recently participated backed by relevant facts and figures. in the World Universities Debating Championship 2010. Organized by Koç University Debating Club, the thirtieth World Universities Debating Championship hosted 1250 debaters from 60 universities between 27th of Dec 2009 and 4th of Jan 2010 in Antalya. Teams included debating giants such as Harvard, Princeton, Duke, Oxford, Cambridge, Stanford and Sydney.

Four teams, with two speakers each, contested in one debate and were given only 15 minutes to prepare their cases. In spite of short preparation time, the teams were able to generate quality arguments

The FAST-NU team (FAST-NU) was represented by Samir Anwar Butt and Saran Ahmad of Islamabad Campus. They competed against teams such as of Duke University and the University of British Columbia. The team grabbed first position in first round and second in two other rounds of debating. Oxford A, LSE A, Sydney A and Harvard A qualified for the Grand Final of the Worlds 2010. Nine adjudicators took hours to come to the decision and declared the University of Sydney as the World Champions for 2010.
